John Bradburn Chief Materials and Sustainability Officer – Pathway21

Meet Mr. John Bradburn Chief Materials and Sustainability

**Officer - Pathway21.** We are honored to have John as our 2018 Conference Keynote. John recently retired in early 2018 as the Global Manager of Waste Reduction for General Motors after 39 years of service. In his waste reduction role, he led the company's landfill-free, zero waste initiative, which resulted in an industry leading 152 GM operations around the world that reuse, recycle, and convert to energy all waste from daily operations. John is an expert in waste reduction and recycling and was dubbed GM's MacGyver for devising unconventional uses for everyday waste. Communications of this work exceeds 1 billion media impressions. John frequently mentor's other companies pursuing zero-waste goals and sustainable material management.

In 2015, John received the Presidential Lifetime Service Award from the Office of the President of the United States for sustainability services to youth. He serves on the advisory board of the U.S. Business Council for Sustainable Development.

John earned a Master of Science degree in hazardous waste management from Wayne State University in Detroit in 1995 and a Bachelor of Science degree in conservation from Northern Michigan University in 1978. He is a certified Hazardous Materials Manager.


