




#### **US RED MEAT & POULTRY CONSUMPTION**

# U.S. Per Capita Egg Consumption Since 1998







#### Figure 2. MSW Recycling and Composting Rates, 1960 to 2015







Figure 1. MSW Generation Rates, 1960 to 2015

#### Figure 12. National Landfill Tipping Fees, 1982-2015 (\$2015 per ton)







Figure 11. Indexed Recycled Commodity Values by Year



#### Wages, Tax and Jobs Attributable to Recycling



Recycling and reuse activities in the United States accounted for (2007 data):

- **757,000 jobs** (1.57 jobs for every 1,000 tons of materials recycled);
- **\$36.6 billion** in wages; and
- **\$6.7 billion** in tax revenues.

### **Recycling Economics**

### 136 million tons landfilled

- 31% recyclable materials with commodity value of \$8.9 billion
- Total tipping fee = \$6.7 billion






### **Environmental Impacts by Management Practice**


#### Comparing GHG Emissions by Management Practice



### Economy-wide impacts of landfill diversion practices






