

9Fiber is the **only** company on the market to derive multi-tensile strength fibers from marijuana and hemp CBD waste stalks.


OUR MODEL

9Fiber diverts waste from the US hemp and marijuana industries that are responsible for producing hemp, food, seed oil, CBD and cannabis products.

Waste is produced by 3 marco sectors:

- Marijuana production
- Hemp grown for CBD
- Hemp grown for fiber & seeds



Several different markets make up the consumer facing cannabis and hemp market

Producing only oxygen and water as byproducts, we create clean, gum-free hurd and cottonized fiber cheaper, faster and cleaner than any existing technology.

Removes THC/CBD, pesticides, heavy metals while shrinking the current timeline to reach a textile grade fiber from 16 days to a matter of a few hour.

This process creates an additional jobs in the supply chain.



FEDERAL VS. STATE LAW



According to a DEA 2001 position statement: "...products that do not allow THC to enter the body are non-controlled substances lawfully allowed to be sold in the United States. Included in the category of lawful hemp products are textiles, such as clothing made from fiber of cannabis plant stalks."*


SUPPLY LEGISLATION

FEDERAL LEVEL

- 2018 Farm Bill, re-classifying hemp as an agricultural commodity, signed into law in December 2018.
- DEA ruled our feed products are UNREGULATED TRASH in 2001.

STATE LEVEL

- Each state has its own regulations for waste stalk waste disposal.
- No current solution can 100% effectively manage marijuana or hemp waste.
- As of 2017, over 40 states have legalized one or both creating unforeseen levels of waste flooding landfills.




MARKET RESEARCH: FIBER SUPPLY CHAIN

100% of America's hemp fiber products are imported. China has long dominated the fiber market, followed by the EU, Eastern Europe and Near Asia.


The projected growth assumes that no innovation and no domestic supply will emerge.
